#### 1.3 Policy Objectives

- Increasing the nutrition level and food security of people through increased fish production
- Minimizing post-harvest losses and improving the quality of fish supply up to accepted standards
- Increasing employment generation and socio-economic condition of the fisher community through fisheries and fisheries related industries.
- Boosting foreign exchanged income through non-traditional fishery products.
- Fisheries and aquatic resources conservation to ensure the biological sustainability of fisheries resources

#### 1.4 Key Functions of the Ministry

- Provision of fish products at an affordable price satisfying the requirements of the consumers
- Development of marine, brackish water and inland fisheries industry
- Formulation and implementation of policies and programmes
- Development and sustainable utilization of national aquatic resources
- Implementation of programmes to the effect that production quality is enhanced to the international standards
- Facilitation for the exportation of fish products

#### 1.5 Scope of the Ministry

The key governing body of Sri Lankan fisheries is the Ministry of Agriculture, Rural Economic Affairs, Livestock Development, Irrigation and Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Development and, it directly involves in the formulation of polices, strategies and planning for the sustainable development of the fisheries resources.

Fisheries industry has taken a giant leap ahead with the newly implemented projects and programmes and, it is projected that national policy objectives will be achieved through such implementations.

A sea area of 517,000 square Km Sri Lankan waters, and 489,000 hectares of brackish water and inland waters comes under the purview of the Ministry.

Ministry of Agriculture, Rural Economic Affairs, Livestock Development, Irrigation and Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Development, with the support of other affiliated institutions, takes in to consideration the favorable socio-economic conditions of the country that contribute to achieve the desired advanced development levels. Accordingly, the Ministry and its affiliated institutions are operating their human, physical and financial resources to accomplish the targets specified in the Mid Term Plan for the fisheries in 2018- 2020.

#### 2.0 Progress of the Fisheries Sector in 2018

Sri Lankan fisheries sector mainly consists of 517,00 square Km sea area with abundant fish resource and 489,000 hectares of reservoir system which consist lagoons, estuaries and reservoirs that show high potential of development. The human recourses in the Sri Lankan fisheries industry consist of Sri Lankan fisher community whose livelihood was fishing since the time immemorial and related indirect employees. It is applaud able that the government has constructed a significant number of infrastructure facilities with a view to uplifting Sri Lankan fisheries industry which is abundant in natural and human resources

It should be stated that fruitful results could be obtained based on the capital monetary provisions of Rs. 2,736.04 Mn that has been allocated up to now through the budgetary and supplementary estimations of 2018 to the Fisheries sector of the Ministry and the capital provisions allocated to the affiliated Institutions of the fisheries sector were utilized towards the development of the sector through the programmes and projects which were identified on priority-basis and implemented successfully by the Ministry and the Institutions, overcoming numerous challenges unique to the fisheries industry.

Especially, the total fish production during January- December 2018 was marked as 527,060 Mt for which marine and inland sectors have made contribution of 439300Mt and 87690Mt of fish production respectively.

Fish consumption is of paramount importance as a source of animal protein required in increasing the nutritional level of country's people which give them the way to be in good health. Per capita fish consumption was recorded in 2017 as 45.4g per day; the amount could be increased up to 46.0 g in January- December 2018. This amount is expected to be increased further in coming years.

When considering the growth for the contribution to the national economy by the fisheries sector, the contribution of fish exports proves to be remaining at an appreciably high level. From January to December 2018, the total amount of fish and fishery product exports was reported as 27,998 Mt amounting to an export value of Rs 47, 949 Mn. An income of Rs 2,626 Mn could be obtained through export of ornamental fish within the said period.

Steps have been taken to launch projects related to develop infrastructure facilities of all the districts, construction of new houses while renovating the existing houses, establishment of integrated inland fishing villages and develop sanitary facilities while strengthening the desirable outcomes under the programme of "Wewak Samga Gamak" and the housing and livelihood development programme implemented in 2017 with a view to develop the living standards of the fishing community, from January to December 2018.

A number of development projects are in operation in the fisheries sector using provisions allocated for the year 2018. Development of fishery Harbours, anchorages and landing sites, stocking fish fingerling in inland reservoirs to develop inland fisheries industry, introducing new technology to fisheries industry, developing infrastructure for the empowerment of fishing community, construction & renovation of housing for fishermen, livelihood development programmes, coastal rehabilitation & resource management, construction & development of fish breeding centers, development of fishing villages, establishment of integrated fishing villages, cleaning of 10 lagoons, improving the operational efficiency of multiday fishing vessels and purchasing of multiday fishing vessels larger than 55ft. are among the priority projects implemented.

Measures have been taken to amend the rules at national level and empower the legal provisions against illegal fishing, in compliance with the conventions formulated by regional and international organizations to deter the Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) fishing. Also, the illegal fishing activities on Northern Sri Lankan waters by Indian fishermen could be reduced as a result of the continuous bilateral discussions between Sri Lanka and India.

In addition, approval of the Cabinet of Ministers has been granted to the national fisheries policy formulated with technical assistance from Norway, which will pave the way for a sustainable fisheries sector that is capable of meeting future economic trends of the international industry based on policies appropriate to Sri Lankan context. The same policy is scheduled to be tabled in the Parliament to obtain the approval of the house in due course.

A regional conference was conducted by the Ministry on  $21^{st}$  - $22^{nd}$  June 2018 in relation to challenges, objectives and programmes on Blue SDG with the participation of local experts and foreign representatives also giving emphasis to achieve the targets in a successful manner of Sustainable Development Goal 14- Life in the water (Blue SGD), the scope of the Ministry directly contributes to the implementation of related special projects and programmes.

Likewise, NARA has pointed out that the post-harvest losses in fisheries ranging 40% - 60% according to the researchers conducted and it has also recommended suitable strategies to minimize such post-harvest losses. In this regard, multiple measures are being taken such as enhancing the knowledge of fishermen, and modernization of fishing vessels, manufacture of fishing vessels which consist modern technology , use of quality water and ice, reaping fish harvest and landing the same systematically , maintenance of fishery Harbours equipped with cold rooms and hygienic water facilities. Special attention has been paid to these factors which are operated under the purview of the Ministry of Rural Economic Affairs and Fisheries & Aquatic Resources Development in the construction of new Harbours, anchorages and in the renovations of existing venues to make them technologically advanced.

The positive outcomes and achievements secured by the fisheries sector in the year 2018 through achieving all challenges and desired targets will be contributed immensely towards

the social economic development of the country as a whole through the fulfillment of the economic policy of the present government which has expectations to approach towards a blue green economy, Food Security Programme of His Excellency the President, United Nations Sustainable Development Goals as expected.



### 8.0 Total Progress in 2018

#### 8.1 Progress in Fish Production

#### **8.1.1.** Marine Fish production (coastal, offshore/deep sea)

The total volume of marine fish production from January to December 2018, was 527,060 Mt.Although it shows a 4.12% decline in coastal fisheries production due to the adverse weather conditions, the highest contribution to the total fish production has been made by the coastal fisheries industry which accounts fo48.9%.

Deep sea fish production shows an increment of 0.33% in 2018 with compared to the same period in the previous year and accounts for 36.1% to the total fish production.

#### **8.1.2.** Inland and Aquaculture Production

From January to December 2018, the total inland and aquaculture fish production shows a significant increase of 7.11 in comparrission to the same period in the previous year.

MFARD has implemented multiple productive programmes and projects throughout this time period to increase export-oriented products through the promotion of aquaculture in the fields of mariculture, brackish water and inland fisheries.

NAQDA and DFAR have implemented non-traditional fish farming projects with the objective of increasing the domestic fish production in 2018. Accordingly sea-bass farming, fattening of crabs, fattening of Sea-Cucumber in cages and Milkfish farming in abandoned shrimp farms have been implemented in Gampaha, Batticaloa, Mannar, Galle, Trincomalee and Kilinochchi districts in order to improve nutrition status, generate employments, promote exports, and contribute to strengthen the rural economy.

Overall progress achieved in this year reflects the progress of this projects. It is obvious that fisheries productions have been able to achieve a great progress despite then-prevalent adverse weather conditions.

#### 8.1.3 Production of fish fingerling and post-larvae

Measures have been taken to increase fish and shrimp production by stocking ranching fish fingerling, fresh and brackish water shrimp and post-larvae produced in breeding centers of NAQDA and private breeding centers.

#### 8.1.4 Improving fish products related to lagoons

Steps have been taken by the Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources to ensure Sri Lankan lagoons to increase fish production, promote the tourism industry and conservation activities related to lagoons with sustainable management with the participation of private sector. The department is on the move to publish selected 19 lagoons out of 116 in the government gazette which have been selected where participative management committees were set up and mapping had been completed.

#### 8.2 Increase of per capita fish consumption

As 53% contribution has been made to animal protein supply through consume of fish become the main source of animal protein. The per capita fish consumption in the year 2018 remains 46.0 g per day.

#### 8.3. Infrastructure

#### **8.3.1** Infrastructure facilities to increase marine fish production

The CFHC and the Fishery Harbours and Anchorages Project have engaged in developing sites and constructing new avenues according to the requirements ,ensure the quality of fish products by minimizing post-harvest lossesand constructing basic infrastructure facilities including fishery harbours, fish landing sites, ice factories, cold rooms enabling fishing community to engage in fisheries efficiently and productively. At present 21 fishery harbours are in operation and development of 14 fisheries harboursis in progress.

#### 8.4. Fish Exports

Fish export which was adversely affected by the imposition of a ban on fish exports by the European Union show a tremendous growth in 2018 due to the lifting of the ban on fish exports by the European Union

The total amount of fish exports during the period was 27,998 Mt with a total value of Rs. 47,949 Mn. Total quantity and value of fish imported has increased by 12.8% and 22.2% respectively compared to the same period in the previous year

Wet Fish exports have contributed 64.4% to the total export quantity and 62.1% to the total export income in the year 2018.

In 2018, ornamental fish exports have generated revenue of Rs2626Mn and the total export value in 2017 was Rs2288Mn.

It has been able to earn export revenue of Rs 3485Mn and 295 Mn respectively by exporting brackish water prawns and fresh water prawns in 2018. Further 62 Mt of sea weed exports have generated an income of Rs4.72Mn

#### 8.5 Fisheries social development

Social development division of the ministry has implemented numerous projects under the programs of introducing new technology, coastal rehabilitation and resources management program, housing and livelihood development programme, "Wewak samagagamak" program, and lagoon development program in view of developing livelihood of fishing community.

# 8.6 Project on Formulation of National fisheries and aquaculture policies with Technical Assistance from Norway

#### 8.6.1 Introduction

The above three years project has been commenced on 01.01.2017 with the approval of the cabinet. The Norwegian government offers Norwegian Krone 8.3 mm (Rs 150Mn) as a grant and agreed to offer additional provisions for 2019 if necessary at the project meeting held in April 2018. The consultancy services for the implementation of the project provide by Ministry of trade, industry and Fisheries, Norway.

#### 8.6.2 Progress

#### 1. National Fisheries and Aquaculture policy

Formulation of the policy was started in January 2017 and final draft was prepared after having discussion with other stakeholders for nearly a one year. First draft was prepared after having discussions with private sector stakeholders including Fisheries representatives, aquaculture representatives, fish salesmen, fish importers, fishing vessel owners, fishing gear producers, importers, representatives of fisheries corporations as well as Fisheries officers, researchers, university lecturers, representatives of Non-Government Organizations, relevant ministries,

departments. These discussions were held at different locations including Putthalam, Negambo, Trincomalee, Baticaloa, kilinochchi, Kalawawa, Udawalawa, Matara and Galle. First draft forwarded to get the opinion of provincial council members and members of the parliament and second draft was prepared based on their opinions. Copies of the second draft have been circulated Island wide for the information of the general public and general public was informed by Newspaper advertisements .Measures had been taken to present Final draft in Parliament after receiving approval. However it had not been able to present in parliament due to political turmoil that prevailed in the end of 2018. However at present Actions have been taken to present the final draft in parliament.

#### 2. Developing management skills

In 2017, two Legal officers of Fisheries and aquatic resources development and National aquaculture development authority were sent for training on fisheries law to legal office, World Food and Agriculture organization, Rome for the period of 3 months. In 2018, legal officers of the Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources and Attorney Generals Department were sent for the above training programme.

A 10 day training programme on working days under SDG 14 (Life under water) was provided to 12 officers of the Department and the Ministry in the year 2018.

#### 3. Investment Promotion

In 2017, the then Secretary of the Ministry and the Director General of NAQDA took part in the conference on Fisheries sector Investment held in Norway and relevant notes and Power Point Presentations were prepared by the Project. The seminar was held in Sri Lanka in 2018 and facilitates investors from Norway and Sri Lanka to meet and discuss. Two investments projects from Norway have already been implemented in the field of aquaculture.

#### 4. Increasing the Regional Corporation

Since there is a possibility to cause dearth in the fisheries recourses as all the coastal territories located around bay of Bengal competitively move to reap the same fishing recourses, a two day workshop of fisheries resources management was held in Colombo under SDG 14 with the participation of representatives from all states, relevant international organizations (eg.FAO) and the representatives from the kingdom of Norway. Representatives from Maldives, India, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Indonesia, Thailand, Sri Lanka participated to the event. The chief guest of the seminar conducted with the assistance of the Ministry of foreign affairs was the Hon. Minister of finance & Mass media. Special guest of honor of the event was the Hon. State Minister of foreign affairs for the kingdom of Norway. On. Minister of fisheries, the Secretary of the Ministry of foreign affairs, Norwegian ambassador and several other dignitaries were also participated in the event. Arrangements have been made to implement the decision taken at this seminar.

#### 5. Compilation of new laws.

As the exiting fisheries Act and Aqua culture Act does not provide provisions required implementing the new policy, two new Acts are being complied with the approval of the cabinet of Ministers. The Act prepared by the project will be referred to the discussion to committees appointed with the approval of the cabinet of Ministers. The project will provide consultancy services to prepare new required regulations upon the receipt of the approval of the cabinet of Ministers to the new to Acts.

#### 6. Provision of scientific Information for the Management.

In the mid 2018, having deployed a modern recourse expedition vessels of the world, the Dr.Prijatop Nansen ship, the fisheries resources were explored within the exclusive economic zone of Sri Lanka and the report of the same is to be published on 25.10.2019. The preparations of fisheries management programs have been commenced based on the details obtain through the report.

#### 7. The activities of 2019

Following activities are scheduled to be carried out for the year 2019.

- 1. Compilation of required regulations after preparation of fisheries and aqua culture Acts.
- 2. Preparation of proper Master Plan for Fisheries sector.
- 3. Provision of training for another team in India for widening the officers' management capabilities.
- 4. Introduction of temporal and spatial planning for the fisheries sector.
- 5. Planning of a program which is required to convene a regional discussion on Regional Corporation for SDG 14
- 6. Implementation of a training programme on scientific fisheries Management.
- 7. Preparation of a visit in Republic of Norway on fisheries activities on behalf of the team of policy officers in the Ministry.

#### The progress of the grants provided under the Indian Government Aid

Upon the concurrence of the Indian Government to grant an aid amounting to Rs.300 million under the Indian Grant Assistance for the development of fisheries and other sectors in the vicinity of Hambantota District, 7000 bicycles, 1000 sewing machines and 60,000 mamoty blades have been provided to the fisheries and agriculture communities in the Hambantota district by the said project.

And also a 100 million Rupee aid has been granted by the Indian government under Indian Grant assistance to provide 150 fishing tool units for the fishermen in Mullativu District. 150 Boat engines, 150 19 ½ feet fiberglass boats have been handed over to the beneficiaries (fishermen) after handing over the same to the District Secretary, Mullativu with the cabinet approval.
